1. I submit that I am the petitioner herein and as such I am well acquainted
with the facts of the case.

2. I submit that the contents of the material papers may kindly be read as part and parcel of this affidavit for full clarification of my case.

3. I respectfully submit that I have passed I.T.I Certificate course in Electrical Faculty. I joined as a Daily Labour in the year 2001 in respondent No.3 – Temple. I submit that vide order bearing R.Ro.B1/478/2011, dated 15.09.2011 issued by respondent No.3, I joined as an Electrician and have been working as such till date. I submit that I am qualified to be appointed as regular Electrician and there is a clear vacancy of electrician post in respondent no.3- temple

4. I submit that respondent No.3 has addressed a letter bearing Rc.No.B1/1479/2018, dated 15.06.2022 to respondent No.2 that my services are being utilized in Electrical wing basing on my qualification. However, my services were not utilized in the said post till date. I submit that I have been after the respondent authorities with a request to regularize my services in the post of electrician, as I am entitled for the said post

5.I further respectfully submit that a Division Bench of this Hon'ble Court vide order dated 27.02.2024 in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch disposed of the Writ Petition, the relevant portion of which reads as follows:

“Having heard the learned counsel on both sides, this Court is of the considered opinion that marshalling and commission of facts could be of critical importance in order to settle the factual parameters of the clients which, in our considered opinion, the Court, in exercising power under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, are ill-equipped to do. This

Court has suggested that such exercise of fact finding be carried out by an authority and suggested that the Commissioner of Endowments would be an appropriate authority to appreciate the facts with the background of the Endowments Act and the Law. The Petitioners are claiming engagement with different Temples in the State, but, admittedly, under the supervision of the Endowments Commissioner.

In the view of the matter, we are of the considered opinion that it would be in the interest of the party that the matter be relegated to respondent No.2 to adjudicate the claiming of the petitioners. The writ petitions shall be treated as representation. The respondent No.2 shall issue notice of hearing to all the concerned petitioners within one (1) Week from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and shall thereafter fix a date of hearing and endeavor to complete the hearing and pass a speaking order and

6. Therefore, I filed W.P. 10015 of 2024 seeking writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondent authorities in not considering the case of the petitioner for regularization of his services in the category Electrician in respondent No.3- Temple, as arbitrary, illegal, biased, unconstitutional and against the principles of natural justice and also violative of the petitioner's right guaranteed under Articles 14 and 21 of the constitution of India and, consequently, direct the respondent authorities to regularize the services of the petitioner in the category of Electrician in the existing vacancy in respondent No.3- Temple and pass such further or orders in the interest of Justice. For the reasons stated above, it is prayed that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to direct the respondent authorities to pay the scale to the petitioner attached to the post of electrician in respondent No.3- Temple in the existing vacancy,

pending disposed of the above writ petition and pass such other or orders as deem fit and just in the interest of Justice.

7. I, also submit that, this Hon'ble Court was pleased to allow the writ petition on 1.05.2024 as follows:

"Under these circumstances this court seems it appropriate to direct the respondent no.2 to consider the case of the writ petitioner on par with the employees in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch. With the above observations and directions, this writ petition stands allowed. No Order as to Costs.

I further submit that, on receipt of the orders of this Hon'ble Court, the second respondent passed the impugned proceedings dated:09.12.2024, in R.C No. A1/11026(48)/3/2024, - 37, and held that the petitioner has relied on certain Judgments of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The authority Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court is Umadevi's case (2006) 4SCC 1. Wherein, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The authority judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has observed that regularization of temporary / casual / daily wage/ NMRs would defeat the Constitutional Scheme under Article 14 & 16 of the constitution of India. The present writ petition is filed, challenging the proceedings dated 09.12.2024 in Rc.No.A1/11026(48)/3/2024-37, as illegal, arbitrary, biased, unconstitutional, against the principles of natural justice for the following among other.

GROUNDS

- a) the respondent authorities are legitimately expected to consider the case of the petitioner for regularization of his services in the category of Electrician in respondent No.3-Temple in the existing vacancy.
- b) The impugned proceedings in rejection the case of the petitioner for regularization of his services in the category of Electrician in the existing vacancy is wholly arbitrary, unfair, misuse of power and non-application of mind and thus, violative of the petitioner's right guaranteed under article 14 of the Constitution of India.
- c) the action of the respondent authorities in not considering the case of the petitioner for regularization of his services in the category of Electrician in the existing vacancy is wholly arbitrary, unfair misuse of power and non-application of mind and thus, violative of the petitioner's right guaranteed under Article 14 of the Constitution of India.
- d) The commissioner failed to consider that petitioner is only the person having adequate qualification for the post of electrician. As he successfully

completed ITI (electrical) in the year 2002 itself. Since, his appointment in the year 2002, he has been in uninterrupted service

e) The commissioner considered enhancement of salary to the petitioner (Electrician) and two helpers in the years 2011 itself.

f) The commissioner also failed consider that two helpers were regularized in the year 2012 Engineering section (electrical department) even without regularizing the petitioner (electrician) at the relevant point of time.

9 I submit that I have no other alternative remedy except to invoke the extraordinary jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

10. I submit that I have not filed any other writ petition and initiated any proceedings before any Court or any authorities for the same and substantial relief that is prayed in this writ petition.

For the reason stated above, it is, therefore prayed that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to issue a Writ, order or direction, more particularly a Writ of Mandamus, declaring the impugned proceedings dated 09.12.2024, proceedings in Rc.No.A1/11026(48)/3/2024-37, of the respondent authorities in rejecting the case of the petitioner for regularization of his service in the category of Electrician in respondent No.3-Temple, as arbitrary, illegal, biased, unconstitutional and against the principles of natural justice and also violative of the petitioner's right guaranteed under Articles 14 and 21 of the constitution of India and consequently, direct the respondent authorities to regularize the service

of the petitioner in the category of Electrician in the existing vacancy in respondent No.3-Temple and pass such further order or orders in the interest of Justice

Some of Daily wage workers / NMRs / Contract employees on consolidated pay working in various Charitable and Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments have filed certain Writ Petitions before the Hon'ble High Court of A.P., for regularization of their services in the institutions concerned. After hearing both sides, without going into merits, the Hon'ble Court have disposed of the batch writ petitions vide common order dated 27.02.2024, relegating the matter to the Commissioner of Endowments to adjudicate the claims of the petitioners by treating the said writ petitions as their representations and that the Commissioner shall issue notice of hearing to all the concerned petitioners and pass a speaking order.

In pursuance of common orders of Hon'ble High Court in reference 1st cited, the Commissioner of Endowments has issued hearing notice to Sri Banala Ramesh, Petitioner in W.P.No.10015 of 2024, by giving an opportunity of personal hearing vide reference 2nd cited and accordingly conducted enquiry.

The petitioner appeared personally along with his Advocate and the Executive Officer of the concerned institution has attended.

Heard both sides and examined the record.

The claim of the petitioner is for regularization of services on account of long period of service rendered in the institution. Since the institution concerned was published under Sec 6 of the A.P.C & H.R.I and Endowments Act, 1987 (the Act 30 of 1987) and thus the institution is under the administrative control of Endowments Department. The service conditions of employees of the Endowment institutions are governed by the A.P.C & H.R.I and Endowments Office Holders and Servants Service Rules, 2000 framed under G.O.Ms.No.888, Revenue (Endowments-I) Department, Dt.08.12.2000.

Rule-46 of the rules issued under G.O.Ms.No.888, Dt.08.12.2000, prescribes procedure for direct recruitment. Wherein, it is stated that any vacancy to be filled up by direct recruitment shall be notified by the Executive Officer to the Employment exchange having jurisdiction over the institution, as well as by way of paper notification. Selection of the candidates shall be made by the committee to be constituted by the Commissioner and the said committee shall conduct a written examination followed by oral test by observing the rule of reservation.

As per Rule-38 of the said Rules, the Commissioner of Endowments is the competent authority to fix-up the cadre strength of each class and category of posts in the institution upto the category of senior assistant. In respect of the post of Superintendent and above in the institution, the Commissioner shall consult the Government before according such sanction of post.

Rule-39, prescribes qualifications as specified in column (4) of Annexure-III appended to the Rules by the method specified in column (3) thereof.

The Government have issued G.O Rt.No.1997, Revenue (Endowments-I) Department, Dt.18.10.2005, prohibiting further recruitment of all administrative staff in Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments, until further orders. The said G.O is still in-force.

The petitioner was not entered into service in the establishment of institution concerned through any selection process as envisaged under Rule-46 of the rules framed under G.O.Ms.No.828, Dt.08.12.2000 and as amended vide G.O.Ms.No.231, Dt.01.06.2023.

The petitioner has been receiving minimum basic pay attached to the post concerned without allowances such as HRA, DA, CCA, etc., as consolidated pay in view of Government Memo No.36021/32/Endowments-I(2)/2018, Dt.05.12.2018 and consequential proceedings of the Commissioner in Rc.No.COE-/11026/64/2018, Dt.12.12.2018, which were issued in pursuance of orders of the Hon'ble High Court in some writ petitions basing on the principle of "equal pay for equal work" as observed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case between State of Punjab Vs. Jagjit Singh & Others.

In the light of above facts, the undersigned has taken up the matter to comply with common orders dated 27.02.2024 in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 & batch of the Hon'ble Court.

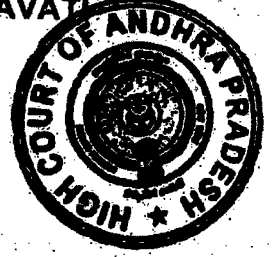

The Court made the following ORAL ORDER:

Heard Sri D.S.N.V. Prasad Babu, learned Counsel for the Writ Petitioner (appeared through video conference); Sri Vamsi Krishna, Learned Assistant Government Pleader for Endowments appearing for Respondent Nos.1 and 2 and Ms. Pulipati Radhika, learned Standing Counsel for Respondent No.3.

2. Learned Counsel for the Writ Petitioner has drawn the attention of this Court to an Order passed by the Hon'ble Division Bench of this Court in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch dated 27.02.2024 (Ex.P.4). He would submit that the Writ Petitioner herein is also similarly placed as that of the Writ Petitioners in the W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch, and therefore, would urge this Court that the Writ Petitioner herein is also entitled to similar benefit as is given to the Writ Petitioners in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch.

3. Sri Vamsi Krishna, Learned Assistant Government Pleader for Endowments appearing for Respondent Nos.1 and 2 has submitted the Written Instruction issued by the Deputy Commissioner. The same is taken on record. In Para No.3 of the Written Instruction, it is stated that the Writ Petitioner was originally not selected through any selection process as envisaged under Rule-46 of A.P.C & H.R.I and E Office Holders and Servants Service Rules, 2000 (vide G.O.Ms.No.888 dated 08.12.2000). In Para No.7 of the Written Instruction, it is indicated that the other employees who were

parties in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch are now being considered for regularization in compliance with the Order passed by the Hon'ble Division Bench in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch dated 27.02.2024 (Ex.P.4). Learned Counsel for the Writ Petitioner would submit that though the Writ Petitioner is also similarly situated, he could not approach the Court, and for that reason, the Respondents have not considered the candidature of the Writ Petitioner.

4. Under these circumstances, this Court deems it appropriate to direct the Respondent No.2 to consider the case of the Writ Petitioner on par with the employees in W.P.No.23424 of 2020 and batch.

5. With the above observations and directions, this Writ Petition stands allowed. No Order as to Costs.

6. Interlocutory Applications, if any, stand closed in terms of this Order.

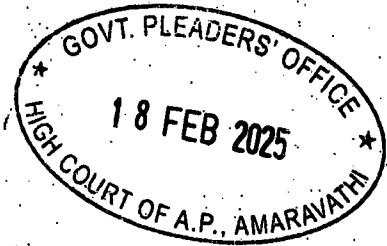

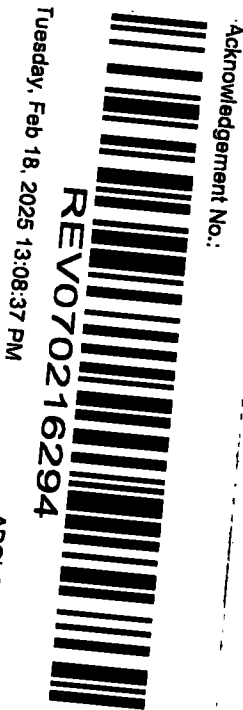
