**AFFIDAVIT**

I, Dr. Kopalle Hanumantha Rao, S/o Late Srinivasa Rao, aged about 57 years, R/o Vijayawada, do hereby solemnly affirm and state of oath as follows.

1. I am the founder family member of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution as such I am well acquainted with the facts of the case.
2. I submit that the present Writ Petition is being filed challenging the action of the respondents No.1 to 3 in initiating steps to take over

the Management of 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution by the Government of A.P. contrary to the Provisions of Act 30 of 1987 (the Andhra Pradesh Charitable & Hindu Religious Institutions & Endowments Act, 1987) and also contrary to the provisions of A.P. Education Act 1982 is highly illegal, arbitrary, unconstitutional, colourable exercise of the power and contrary to the objects and aims of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution and consequently direct the respondents No.1 to 3 to differ / rescind the steps to take over the Management of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution by the Government of A.P.

3. I submit that my grandfather Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao Panthulu Garu was a renowned educationist and stalwart freedom fighter in the time of Pre-Independent India. He actively participated in the Indian Freedom Movement by closely associating with Sri Lala Lajapathi Roy, Sri Bala Gangadhar Tilak and Sri Bipin Chandra Pal (Lal-Bal-Pal). He also led the Indian National Congress in South India, before Gandhian era. The conglomeration of his ideologies towards Swaraj and also the Swadeshi movement in response to the Nation's call to make India self-sufficient, he put forward a constructive work by bequeathing his family property for the establishment of a flagship institution known as **Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad**, on 17<sup>th</sup> November, 1907 to impart and promote the education-Literary, Scientific, Technical and professional on national lines and exclusively under national control-attaching special importance to a knowledge of the country, its literature, history and philosophy, and designed to incorporate with the best Oriental ideals of life and thought the best assimilable ideals of the West to inspire students with a genuine love for their country and a real desire to serve it.

4. I submit that the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad (herein after called as Parishad) itself was registered under the Act XXI of 1860, on 19-6-1911. The foundation stone for the construction of the Institution

building was laid on 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1909. The institution was inaugurated by "Desabhaktha" Sri Konda Venkatappayya Panthulu garu on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1910. Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao Panthulu Garu served as the Founder Principal of the Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala and put strenuous efforts in collecting funds required to run the institution for many years. Inspired with his commitment, dedication and patriotic fervour in the establishment of the Institution, a number of people contributed their mite.

5. I submit that the father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, who visited Machilipatnam twice, had cherished spending a couple of days at the Kalasala premises. A few lines he had written in the visitors' book on April 3, 1921 are still considered a driving force. An inscription of his valuable words at his memorial on the Institution premises has been inspiring and safeguarding the institution. It has produced many scholars, educationists, doctors, engineers and leaders who served the nation in all walks of life, Sri Bezawada Gopala Reddy, Sri Surisetty Anjaneyulu and Sri Nori Dattatreyyudu are a few notable persons from our Alumni. Eminent scholars like Kavisamrat Sri Viswanatha Satyanarayana garu (Gnanapeetha Awardee), Sri Pingali Venkaiah garu (designer of the Indian National Flag), Sri Adivi Bapirajugaru, and many leaders like Sri Mutnuri Krishna Rao, Sri Bhogaraju PattabhiSitaramaiah have all served the institution.

6. I submit that as a part of curriculum, the institution, at the time of its inception, introduced various courses in ancient Indian fine arts like Shilpa Sastra (Sculpture), Vasthu Sastra, Chitra Lekhana (Drawing) and Weaving. Further, the Institution had passed through a tumultuous regime during the peak freedom movement and had its complete revival with the change in Educational System in the post-Independence era as such the ancient Indian fine art courses were closed due to lack of proper support from the affiliating authorities.

7. I submit that the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad is imparting education through the following subsidiary educational institutions (Private) under the provisions of A.P. Education Act, 1982, viz.,

- 1) The A.J. Kalasala offered U.G. Courses since 07.06.1949. Subsequently, Intermediate (Senior Secondary) Education was introduced on 14.06.1969. The Government of Andhra Pradesh extended grant-in-aid for AJ Kalasala (Composite College) from 1964.
- 2) The AJK Oriental Secondary School was started in 1959 to impart School Education (6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class) with Sanskrit as one of the main subjects. The AJK Oriental Secondary School was started in 1959 to impart School Education (6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class) with Sanskrit as one of the main subjects. The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad established A.J.K. Oriental Secondary School in 1959 to impart education-literacy with history and philosophy of our nation with a mix of knowledge from the Vedas and modern education as the Vedas are considered to be the oldest form of literature in Sanskrit and it is a language of ancient India with a history going back about 3,500 years with primary liturgical language of Hinduism and the predominant language of most works of Hindu philosophy as well as some of the principal texts of Buddhism and Jainism which was migrated to Southeast Asia, parts of East Asia and Central Asia, emerging as a language of high culture and of local ruling elites in these regions and it is traceable to the 2<sup>nd</sup> millennium BCE in a form known as the Vedic Sanskrit, with the Rigveda as the earliest known composition, though it not necessarily Classical Sanskrit, is the root language of many Prakrit languages such as Hindi, Marathi, Bengali, Punjabi and Nepali. As such, the school curriculum is primarily aimed at promoting Sanskrit language and it is included as main subject for 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class curriculum in place of Social Studies and was extended grant-in-aid from 1975 by the Government of Andhra Pradesh and still it is in existence as aided school.
- 3) The AJ College of Education was started to offer Teacher Education course (B.Ed) in 1967 and was extended grant-in-aid from 1977.
- 4) The Engineering workshop offered industrial training courses from 1907 and it was re-designed as Industrial Training Institute (ITI) from 1951.

G.J.V. Jagannadha Raju, VC, Nagarjuna University 3) Sri Jaffer Nizam representative of Commissionerate of Higher Education and 4) District Collector, Krishna under the Convenor-ship of Commissioner, Endowments to examine and submit a comprehensive report on the following points along with the Committee's recommendations dated 28.05.87:

- 1. Verification of the Extent of land and Physical infrastructure owned by the Institution.**
- 2. The existing institutional framework and financial resources with reference to the objectives.**
- 3. Identification of new courses, consistent with the changing times.**
- 4. The method and extent of affiliation and associations between the various universities in the State add this Instruction.**
- 5. The pattern of administrative and technical control of this institution vis-à-vis the provisions of the Hindu religious and charitable Endowment Act.**
- 6. The new educational requirements, which this institution can serve in the context of modern science, technology and Human Resources Development".**

The Committee constituted under G.O.Ms. No. 531 Revenue (Endts.IV) Department dated 28.05.1987 has made a comprehensive study of the various issues referred to them and submitted its report through Commissioner, Endowments to Government on 28.03.1988 & 02.05.1990. In turn the Government has carefully studied the reports of the Committee and the recommendations made therein and felt that there is a need for restructuring this institution without prejudice to the original objectives and accorded permission to the Commissioner, Endowments through G.O.Ms.No.655 Revenue (Endts. IV) Dept., dt.11.07.1990 and further requested the Commissioner of Endowments Department to explore the possibilities of getting financial assistance under the different schemes of the State Government and the Government of India

8. While things stood thus the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution was published U/Sec.6 (b) (1) of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious and Endowments Act, 1966 (Act 17 of 1966) duly registered U/s 38 of the Act 17 of 1966 (present provision is Sec.43 of Act 30 of 1987). In 1979, the Government issued instructions to the Commissioner, Endowments Department to enquire and submit a report on the affairs of the management. After due consideration of the representation made by the Secretary of Parishad for exempting the Institution U/sec.108 of the Act 17 of 1966, the Government requested the commissioner to constitute a trust board and to appoint an Executive officer for its management, accordingly, the Executive Officer was appointed on 10.09.1980.

9. I further submit that assailing the correctness of the taking over the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution, W.P.No.4534 of 1980 was filed before the Composite High Court of A.P. and the same was dismissed through orders dated 6.7.1981 and the said orders were confirmed by the Hon'ble Division Bench of Hon'ble High Court through orders dated 01.12.1986 in W.A.No.427 of 1981.

10. While so, the Act 17 of 1966 was repealed and Act 30 of 1987 came into force w.e.f. 28.05.1987. I submit that at this juncture, one Sri K. Koteswara Rao, Editor, Telugu Vidyarthi (Monthly Publication) and Member of Legislative Council, Machilipatnam had submitted a representation to the Government (Letter dated 19-5-1987) requesting to take over the management to facilitate the development of the historic institution in accordance with the objects for which the institution was founded. On the request made by late Sri K. Koteswara Rao, the then Government of A.P. constituted a committee with four persons as members viz., 1) Sri K. Koteswara Rao, 2) Sri

and send if necessary, specific proposals to the Government and G.O.Ms. No. 655, Rev (End. IV),dt: 11.07.1990 holds the field.

11. While things stood thus, I was recognized being descendant of the Founder of the subject Institution, as Founder Family Member for the management of the Institution and for all other purposes vide Rc.No.A2/10564/98dated 27.01.1999. After assuming the charge as FFM of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution, in order to implement the aims and objects of 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution and its founder as under:

- a. By defending a proposal that was moved for amalgamation of the Parishad into Krishna University vide W.P.No.5262 of 2009.
- b. Cancellation of 30 years lease of the Parishad main campus including infrastructure to Krishna University vide W.P.No.13798 of 2010.
- c. Continuation of B.Ed Course under unaided scheme, as the Government has not recruited the aided teaching staff vide W.P.No.22049 of 2013 and got unaided fees structure vide W.P.No.30139 of 2014.
- d. Revival of ongoing M.Ed Course from NCTE from the year 2016-2017 vide W.P.No.14500 of 2000.
- e. Leased out the land of 106 acres of institution for fishing purposes after prolonged legal battle.
- f. Got NAAC accreditation as B ++ to the AJ College of Education for the years 2017-2022.

(Proof evidencing the same, the RJC, MZ-I, Rajahmahendravaram, report vide Rc.No.A3/905/2017, dated 12.03.2017).

12. I submit that it is relevant that on my representation to implement the orders vide G.O. Ms. No. 655, to extend the SamagraSiksha Abhiyan grants for engaging 5 Academic Instructors to AJK Oriental Secondary School till

the aided recruitment is made by School Education Department, the Commissioner, Endowments forwarded the proposals for that limited purpose to the Special Chief Secretary to Govt., School Education Dept., A.P. and to State Project Director, Sarva Siksha Abhiyan for sanction of financial assistance to teachers. Unfortunately, the State Project Director has not considered the proposals with a remark as "not feasible", as there is no budget sanction for Aided Oriental Institutes for the year 2019-20.

13. Further, on 24.07.2020 the Founder Family Member addressed the Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, New Delhi and State Project Director, Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, A.P., by marking copies to Special Chief Secretary, Endowments, A.P. and Special Commissioner, Endowments, Vijayawada for inclusion of the Educational Institutions imparting various courses upto Senior Secondary Level and Teacher Education under the management of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Machilipatnam which is under the administrative control of Commissioner, Endowments Department into Samagra Siksha Abhiyan Scheme on par with Government schools by Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, New Delhi and State Project Director, Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, A.P. duly considering the following:

**1) to implement the orders vide G.O.Ms. No. 655, Rev (End.IV), Dt: 11.07.1990 to extend the SSA Scheme.**

**2) for inclusion into SSA Scheme on par with Government Schools by exercising the flexibility**



**given to the States to prioritize their interventions.**

**3) to allot budget to aided Oriental Schools and Institutions imparting 10+2 Education of AJ Vidya Parishad under the control of Endowments Department from the Academic year 2020-21 and.**

**4) to extend the financial support to the Vidya Volunteers / Academic Instructors in the existing vacancies of above mentioned institutions from the academic year 2020-21, till the decision taken by the Secretary, SEL, MHRD, New Delhi for inclusion of above institutions into SSA Scheme on par with other Government Institutions.**

As there was no response from the authorities concerned, I constrained to file W.P.No.15015 of 2020 before this Hon'ble Court and the same was disposed at admission stage to consider my request in accordance with law.

14. While so, in order to implement the evil ideas of party in power to have a reins of institution, have made representations through the busybodies to the government to take over the Management of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution. The persons, who are in power and the busybodies are pretty well that all their efforts to dislodging me as FFM, went futile, hatched a plan to take the reins of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution in the hands of private person unconnected with the affairs of the institution and without having any attachment to the institution and its founder, the 1<sup>st</sup> respondent has directed the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent through Memo dated 20.10.2024 to get the immediate action for taking over the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution. Pursuant to the same, the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent has directed the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent herein through Memo dated 3.2.2025 directed the Executive Officer of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution to submit a detailed report to implement the evil and devil idea of vested interest. In obedience to the

said communication, the Executive Officer of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution through letter dated 3.3.2025 asked me to submit my opinion on the taking over of the subject institution within 3 days, as if I am his subordinate. I have been anticipating the evil idea of the busybodies and their supporters, who are in power submitted letter dated 6.3.2025 wherein and whereby the following 2 quarries for raised by me, which reads as follows:

- a. ***Specify, whether the government is intended to taking over the administration of Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala or Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad with the ideology of government to take such step against these organizations alone in Krishna District.***
- b. ***Circulate the relevant rule position to protect the entity of a charitable institution and / or the established procedure to take over the private charitable institution, which is under the Administrative Control of Endowments Department, if any.***

The Executive Officer of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent – Institution without answering my quarries as above, did postman job, submitted my letter to the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent herein. The respondents No.1, 2 and 3 having well versed with the provisions of the Act 30 of 1987 in its letter and spirit failed to answer my quarries.

15. As I have already submitted in the previous paras that the political big-bosses, who are in power dislodging me from the FFM, the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent directed the Deputy Commissioner, Endowments Department, Kakinada, through letter dated 15.03.2025 to conduct a detailed enquiry against me and to submit a point wise detailed report based on such enquiry. The Deputy Commissioner, Endowments Department, Kakinada has immediately swing into action to implement the evil ideas of political big bosses, formed a battery of officers of the

Endowments Department to conduct enquiry on 19.03.2025 at 10:00 AM on the alleged representation made by busybodies, without serving notice on me and without supplying the copy to me, having felt aggrieved by the highhanded action of the statutory authorities, who are supposed to discharge their statutory duties within the frame work of the statue, I filed W.P.No.7251 of 2025 before this Hon'ble Court and this Hon'ble Court was pleased to grant interim order through orders dated 20.03.2025.

16. I submit that the respondents No.1 to 3 in order to satisfy the illegal instructions issued by the political bosses who are in power, taking steps to take over the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution by the Government, which action of the respondents is highly illegal, arbitrary, unconstitutional, colourable exercise of the power, for the following among other:

#### GROUND

- a. Charitable Institution is defined U/Sec.2(4) of the Act *"any establishment, undertaking, organisation or association formed for a charitable purpose and includes a specific endowment and dharmadayam; (5) 'charitable purpose' includes (a) relief of poverty or distress; (b) education; (c) medical relief; (d) advancement of any other object of utility or welfare to the general public or a section thereof not being an object of an exclusively religious nature"*.
- b. Section 14 of the Act 30 of 1987 postulates as follows:  
*"All properties belonging to, or given or endowed to a charitable or religious institution or endowment shall, vest in the charitable or religious institution or endowment, as the case may be."*

- c. The respondents No.1 to 3 ought to have seen that when the administration of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution taken over by the Endowment Department, when the said action was called in question by way of filing writ petition No.4534 of 1980, the Hon'ble composite High Court of A.P. affirmed the said action of the Government through orders dated 6.7.1981 as confirmed by the Hon'ble Division Bench in W.A.No.427 of 1981, dated 01.12.1986.
- d. The respondents No.1 to 3 ought to have seen that when the similar attempt was made by one Sri Kolluru Koteswara Rao, Ex-MLC, Machilipatnam to take over the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution by the government, the then Government in order to achieve and implement the aims and objectives of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-institution, considered the said request of the individual and constituted a committee through G.O.M.No.531, dated 28.5.1987, wherein and whereby, the government requested the committee members to submit their recommendations. Pursuant to their recommendation only, the then government, in consultation with the then Commissioner, Endowments Department, decided to take action in consonance with the Column-3 of the G.O.Ms.NO.655, dated 11.7.1990 and continues the status of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent institution under the Administrative Control of Endowment Department. The stand of the Government is very crystal clear regarding the continuation of the institution under the Endowments Department, the present 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respondents to fulfill their political big bosses wishes contemplating to proceed further. In such event the aims and objectives of the founder of the institution will be jeopardize, institution in particular and students at large will

be suffer. Hence, the present writ petition, seeking indulgence of this Hon'ble Court.

17. I submit that the petitioner have no other alternative and efficacious remedy except to approach this Hon'ble High Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for necessary relief. I submit that the Petitioner have not filed any writ, suit, or any other proceedings in any Court praying for the same relief.

It is therefore prayed that this Hon'ble High Court may be pleased to issue a writ order or directions more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents No.1 to 3 in initiating steps to take over the Management of 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution by the Government of A.P. contrary to the Provisions of Act 30 of 1987 (the Andhra Pradesh Charitable & Hindu Religious Institutions & Endowments Act, 1987) and also contrary to the provisions of A.P. Education Act 1982 is highly illegal, arbitrary, unconstitutional, colourable exercise of the power, contrary to Article 26 of the Constitution of India and contrary to the objects and aims of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution and consequently direct the respondents No.1 and 2 to implement the G.O.Ms.No.655, dated 11.7.1990, especially recommendation No.11 and to pass such other order or orders as this Hon'ble High Court deems fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

It is also further prayed that this Hon'ble High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents No.1 to 3 to differ / rescind the steps to take over the Management of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent-Institution by the Government of A.P. pending disposal of the writ petition and to pass such further order or other orders as this Hon'ble High Court deems fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

## MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

In the matter of Act XXI of 1860 of the Acts of the Viceroy and Governor-General of India in Council, being an Act for the registration of Library, Scientific and Charitable societies and in the matter of The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad (the Andhra National Council of Education).

1. The name of the Association is the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad.
2. The objects of the Association are:
  - a. To impart and promote the imparting of education-Literary, Scientific, Technical and Professional on national lines and exclusively under national control-attaching special importance to a knowledge of the country, its literature, history and philosophy, and designed to incorporate with the best Oriental ideals of life and thought the best assimilable ideals of the West to inspire students with a genuine love for their country and a real desire to serve it.
  - b. To promote and encourage the study chiefly of such branches of the Arts, Sciences, Industries and Commerce as are best calculated to develop the material resources of the country and to satisfy its pressing wants, including in scientific education generally a knowledge of the scientific truths embodied in Oriental learning and in medical education specially, a knowledge of such scientific truths as are to be found in the Ayurvedic and Hakimi systems.
  - c. To promote physical and moral education.
  - d. To provide for religious education. Such education, however, is not to include the enforcement of religious rites and practices. It is to be presumed that the members of the different religious bodies desire that their wards should receive religious education in their respective creeds unless the guardians of such wards express a contrary intention.
  - e. To enforce strict discipline in accordance with the best traditions of the country.
  - f. To impart and to facilitate the imparting of education ordinarily through the medium of the vernacular language.
  - g. To establish at Masulipatnam and elsewhere in the Andhra country schools, primary and secondary, as well as colleges, and other educational institutions for the imparting of education as aforesaid.
  - h. To affiliate, admit, recognise or otherwise utilise schools, colleges and other educational and research institutions for the imparting of education as aforesaid.

- 20-
- i. To prepare and encourage the preparation of suitable text books especially in the vernaculars in arts, sciences and technical and professional subjects.
  - j. To found and maintain professorships, lectureships, scholarships and fellowships for the encouragements of learning and research.
  - k. To create and maintain a high standard of qualification, intellectual as well as moral, in teachers by providing where necessary advances instruction in all subjects included in a liberal education, by supplying a training in the principles and practice of educational methods and by instituting examinations for testing such qualifications and granting certificates to successful candidates.
  - l. To establish and maintain affiliate, admit or recognise hospitals, workshops, laboratories, libraries and museums, art galleries and other institutions conducive to the objects of the Association.
  - m. To establish, maintain and control suitable boarding houses and residences for students prosecuting their studies in institutions connected with the Association.
  - n. To provide for examination of students prosecuting their studies in institutions connected with the association, to award certificates to successful students, to award prizes, stipends and scholarships for enabling them to prosecute further studies either in institution connection with the Association or other educational institutions in India or elsewhere.
  - o. To confer titles, diplomas and other marks of honour on any person who by reason of eminent position and attainments may be deemed a fit and proper person to receive the same and to grant certificates and diplomas, confer degrees, titles, distinctions and other marks of honour on students who pass the requisite tests.
  - p. To print and publish any journals, periodical books, or leaflets that the Association may think desirable for the promotion of its objects.
  - q. To carry on any other work which may seem to the Association capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Association's property or rights.
  - r. To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire property movable or immovable and any right or privileges which may be deemed necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Association and in particular any lands, buildings, and easements and to improve, develop, manage, sell, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or part of the property of the Association.

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- s. To construct, maintain and alter any houses buildings or works necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Association.
- t. To take any gift or property whether subject to any special trust or condition or not for any one or more of the objects of the Association.
- u. To take such steps by personal or written appeals, public meetings or otherwise as may from time to time be deemed expedient, for the purpose of procuring contributions to the funds of the Association in the shape of donations, annual subscriptions or otherwise.
- v. For the purpose of the Association to borrow and raise money.
- w. To invest the moneys of the Association not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as the Association may think fit.
- x. To undertake and execute any trusts other than religious or any agency business which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to any of the objects of the Association gratuitously or otherwise.
- y. For the purposes of the Association to make, accept, endorse, and execute promissory notes, bills of exchange and negotiable instruments.
- z. To incorporate any institutions, societies or Associations having objects wholly or in part similar to those of the association.
- aa. To procure the affiliation of one or more of the institutions of the Parishad to any other institution, society or association, having objects similar to those of its own or to the Andhra University.
- bb. To provide a superannuation fund for the professors, lecturers, officers and servants of the Association or otherwise assist them, and their families.
- cc. To do all or any of the above things either as principals, agents, trustees or otherwise and by or through trustees, agents or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.
- dd. To do all such other; things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.
- 3. The names, addresses and occupation of the persons who are members of and form the Governing Body of the Association are:
- 4. The income and property of the Association whence-so ever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association as set forth in the Memorandum and no portion thereof

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shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus, remuneration or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to any of the members of the Association in respect of any services performed by them as members of the Association, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of remuneration to any officers or servants of the Association notwithstanding they may also be members thereof, in return for any work done or services rendered to the Association, as such officers or servants, nor prevent the payment of interest on monies borrowed from any member of the Association.

5. No trustee or trustees of the Association shall be answerable for any loss arising in the administration or application of the properties of the Association or for any damage or deterioration in the trust properties unless such loss, damages or deterioration shall happen by or through his or their neglect or willful default.

A copy of the rules and regulations of the said Parishad is filed with this Memorandum of Association and the undersigned being members of the governing Body of the Association do hereby certify that such copy of such rules and regulations of the said Parishad is correct.

## **RULES**

Rules relating to the Constitution and management of the Association named The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad.

## **CONSTITUTION**

1. The Association or Parishad shall consist of:
  - (1) Ordinary members
  - (2) Patron members
2. Any person who has given a contribution of not less than Rs.100 or its equivalent to the funds of the Parishad becomes an Ordinary member thereof on his expressing sympathy in writing with the objects of the Parishad.
3. Any person who has given a contribution of not less than Rs.1000 or its equivalent to the Parishad becomes a Patron member of the Parishad on his expressing sympathy in writing with the objects of the Parishad.
4. Every ordinary member and Patron member of the Parishad shall have the right of (1) visiting and inspecting the institutions of the Parishad and also of recording any suggestions he may have to offer in the visitors' book and (2) electing members to the Council of the Parishad.

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5. The Parishad shall have the right of:

1. Electing as a member of the Parishad without payment any person who, in its opinion, is especially fit to advise in matters educational.
2. Obtaining the affiliation of one or more of the institutions to any other association or body having objects similar to its own or to the Andhra University, Waltair.
3. Removing any member from the Council on the recommendation of the latter, at a meeting of the Council duly held for the purpose.

The Parishad shall meet at least once a year. The quorum shall be twenty of whom not less than five shall be other than members of the Council. It shall appoint its own Secretary for a period of three years and frame its own byelaws for the conduct of its meetings.

The Secretary of the Parishad may, of his own motion or at the requisition of at least 15 members thereof, shall call a meeting of the Parishad.

## M A N A G E M E N T

6. The affairs of the Parishad shall be managed by the following three bodies in accordance with the rules herein after contained:

- ✓ (1) The Council,
- ✓ (2) The Governing body,
- ✓ (3) The Board of Trustees.

7. The Council shall consist of minimum 50 members elected by the Ordinary and Patron members of the Parishad. The members of the Council shall ordinarily hold office for three years. At or about the end of this period or whenever a vacancy arises, the Secretary of the Council shall take steps to see that a fresh election promptly take place.

8. The members of the Council shall be entitled to the use of the libraries, laboratories, museums etc., of the Parishad to all other privileges in accordance with the bye-laws to be framed time to time by the Governing Body, subject to the sanction of the Council.

9. The Council shall have the right to

1. Sanction any appropriation of permanent funds to current purposes on the recommendation of the Governing Body.
2. Start, affiliate, recognize, or disaffiliate and withdraw the privileges of admission and recognition from schools and colleges.

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3. Institute and confer degrees, titles and other marks of honour.
  4. Appoint Faculties, and Boards of Studies.
  5. Call a general meeting of the Parishad.
  6. Publish the auditor's report and balance sheet.
  7. Appoint an auditor or auditors for the audit of the accounts.
  8. Recommend to the Parishad the removal of any member of the Council by the vote of three fourths of the total strength of the Council at a meeting specially called for the purpose.
  9. Remove the trustee from his office on account of physical disability or a criminal conviction for any offence for holding the office which in the opinion of the Council disqualifies him.
  10. The Council shall meet at least twice a year. The quorum shall be ten. It shall frame its own bye-laws for the conduct of its meetings.

## **(2) THE GOVERNING BODY**

11. The Governing Body shall consist of 10 members, elected by the members of the Council from amongst themselves. The members of the Governing Body shall ordinarily hold office for 3 years and at about the end of this period or whenever a vacancy arises, the Secretary of the Body shall take steps to see that a fresh election promptly takes place.  
Provided that in respect of all interim vacancies it shall be competent to them to fill up such vacancies temporarily, until they are filled up by the Council.
12. Any member of the Governing Body who absents himself from the meetings of the Body on three successive occasions or for a period of 2 months during which three or more meetings are held, shall be deemed to have vacated his seat in the Governing Body, but shall be eligible for re-election.
13. Any vacancy resulting from death, resignation, non-attendance or retirement of a member of this Body shall be filled for the unexpired term only.
14. The Governing Body shall arrange for:
  - A. 1. (a) The inspection of schools and colleges, (b) examination and

(c) Teaching, according to regulations passed by the council.

2. the selection of text books, the institution of courses of lectures, the opening of libraries, laboratories, museums etc., and the appointment of Professors, Inspectors, Lecturers, Tutors, Research workers, Demonstrators, Fellows and Scholars.
3. The leasing of property for not more than 5 years.
4. The acceptance of endowments.
5. Exemption from existing rules and regulations.
6. The maintenance of proper accounts.
- B. As regards the following matters, the Governing Body shall have the power to submit their recommendations and opinions to the Council.
  1. Affiliation, admission and recognition or disaffiliation of schools and colleges.
  2. Disposal of property and purchase of property.
  3. Institution and conferring of degrees.
15. The Governing Body shall have power to make rules regarding the internal management of the Parishad's institutions, the fixing and levying of school fess, the grant of scholarships and the boarding and lodging of students. All such rules shall come into force immediately, but are subject to revision by the Council.  
The Governing Body shall also have power to call a meeting of the Parishad when they deem it necessary.
16. The Governing Body shall:
  - i. Receive and collect all subscriptions and donations and may expend or invest the same for the purposes of the Parishad, otherwise than by purchase of property, all investments being made in the names of the Trustees.
  - ii. Prepare and pass the annual Budget.
17. No legal proceedings shall be taken on behalf of the Parishad except with the sanction of the Governing Body. The Governing Body shall have full control over the conduct of all legal proceedings by and against the Parishad.
18. The Council shall nominate one of the members of the Governing Body as the Secretary of the Council and the Governing Body, and the Secretary shall exercise such powers as may be conferred upon him by the regulations of the Council and the Governing Body.
19. The Governing Body shall meet not less than once every month, the quorum being five: It shall pass its own bye-laws for the conduct of its meetings.
20. All questions coming up at the meetings of the several bodies connected with the Parishad shall be decided by a majority of votes of members present except as herein otherwise provided for, and in



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case of equality of votes, the President of the meeting have a second or casting vote.

21. In all bye-elections to the Council or the Governing Body, the voters shall have the privilege of sending their votes in writing duly signed by them to the Council. When however no votes are received at a bye-election the vacancy shall be filled by nomination to be made by the remaining members.
22. When at the end of 3 years no general election takes place for any reason the pre-existing body shall continue in office until a fresh election takes place and the Secretary shall convene two successive meetings at intervals of not more than a month to cause fresh election to take place. If, in spite of these attempts, no elections take place in accordance with the rules, the members present at the 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting shall conduct the elections without regard to quorum.

### **(3) TRUSTEES**

23. There shall be two Trustees, Neither of whom shall hold the office of the Secretary of any of the bodies of the Parishad.
24. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of the Trustees it shall be filled forthwith by the Council.
25. All immoveable property, stocks, funds, shares and other securities, property of the Parishad, shall be vested in the Trustees for the time being, but shall be subject to the control of the Council and no part of such property of the Parishad shall be sold, assigned, transferred, or otherwise dealt with, by the Trustees without the authority of the Council.
26. All legal proceedings by or against the Parishad shall be conducted by and in the name of Trustees.
27. Permanent funds or Property of the Parishad shall include:
  - i. All money grants made by the public, the Government, or the Local Boards with the object of being invested at interest or being applied to the purchase of articles for the use of the Parishad or to the permanent payment of the salaries of teachers, scholarships, or prizes in the institutions of the Parishad.
  - ii. Such other sums or property as the Governing body makes over to the Council as permanent fund.
28. Current funds shall include:



- i. Proceeds of fees and fines received from students.
  - ii. All money grants other than those specified in the preceding section.
  - iii. Interest accruing on the permanent funds invested.
29. Permanent funds except by the special sanction of the Council shall be reserved for the following purposes:
- i. Purchase and construction of, addition or repairs to, the buildings;
  - ii. Purchase of an addition to the dead stock.

### **ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT**

30. The accounts shall be audited once a year and the report of auditor as well as of the Governing Body shall be adopted at the meeting of the Council which shall publish it to the Parishad at its next annual meeting.

The Parishad shall have a common seal of such make and design as the Governing Body shall determine.

31. The seal shall be affixed to all formal documents in the presence of the Secretary.

This petition coming on hearing on Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1981 upon perusing the petition and the affidavit and the writ and Rule Nisi directed by the order of the High Court dated 16.09.80 and made herein and the records submitted in pursuance thereof, and the counter affidavit filed herein and upon hearing of arguments of M.Chandrasekhar Reddy and CVN Reddy M/s R.Venugopal Reddy Advocate for the Petitioner end of the Govt. Pleader of the GAD on

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behalf of the Respondent No. 1 and 2 and of Mr. V.N. Reddy Advocate for the Respondent No.3 M.Venkata Rayudu, Advocate on behalf of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent herein the court made following the order (WRIT PETITO No. 4534 of 1980)

ORDER :-

The petitioner Institution was established in the year 1907 with a view to impart, and to promote the imparting of education in all its aspects, and to promote the literature, history and philosophy of this country. It is sufficient to say that, according to the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the petitioner-Institution, the objects of the Association are to promote the imparting of education in its Literary, scientific, Technical and Professional fields; to establish Institutions for that purpose; to train all other things in their behalf: students and teachers, and to all other things in their behalf was registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 Until 1967 this institution was managing its affairs, and the Acts governing the charitable endowment in vogue in the former State of Madras, or subsequently in the State of Andhra, or Andhra Pradesh, were sought to be applied to this Institution. After the commencement of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act, 1960, this Institution was included in the list published under section 6(b)(i) of the Act, by the Commissioner of Endowments. It was also registered as one of the institutions governed by the Act, under section 38 of the Act, by proceedings of the Asst. Commissioner, Endowments, Machilipatnam, dated 10-5-1972. The 3<sup>rd</sup> respondent, who was elected as the Secretary of the Institution on 22-11-1970, applied for

exempting this institution from the operation of sections 15, 27, and 59 of the Act. This application for exemption was rejected by the Government. This application for exemption appears to have been prompted by the appointment of an Executive Officer for this institution by the Commissioner of Endowments, by his proceedings dated 25-6-1974. It may be noticed that the provisions from which exemption was sought, related to the appointment of Board of Trustees, Executive Officer, and contribution. It is stated in the counter-affidavit, that the petitioner's application for exemption was rejected in view of the several irregularities pointed out by the Deputy Commissioner. We enquired into the affairs of this institution at different times, as well as the audit objections relating to the years 1972-73 onwards. It appears further that the 3rd respondent, on behalf of the petitioner-institution, applied for revising the orders rejecting the petitioner's application, but this review-petition was also dismissed. Then the petitioner approached this Court by way of this writ petition.

The main contention of Mr.R.Venugopala Reddy, the learned counsel for the petitioner, is that merely because the aims and objects of this institution are educational in nature, it does not become a charitable institution within the meaning of clause (5) of section 2 of the Act. He submits that unless the predominant object or objects are charitable, an institution cannot be said to be a charitable one. He submits that if a wide interpretation is given to the expression 'charitable purpose, every educational institution in the State

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would be a charitable institution. He relies upon a Bench decision of this Court  
in K.P. VARTHAKA- SANGAN VE. COMMISSIONER OF INDOMURIPITS, A.P. (1)  
(1) 1978-(1) A.L... 451.

Mr. Venugopala Reddy further submitted that the misconceived or  
unauthorised act of the Secretary in applying for registration, or for  
exemption, does not estop the petitioner-institution from contending that the  
provisions of the Act do not apply to this institution. He submits that there can  
be no estoppel against law, and the petitioner should not be denied a hearing  
on merits merely because the Secretary applied for registration, or the  
exemption, as the case may be, under the provisions of the Act. This is  
countered by the learned Government Pleader by saying that besides being an  
educational institution, this institution has received extensive charities from  
the members of the public, to an extent of Ac. 350-47 cents of land and that,  
having regard to the conduct of the petitioner institution in having itself  
registered under the Act, and also in view of the several irregularities pointed  
out in the counter-affidavit, and particularly in view of an alternative remedy  
available to the petitioner by way of an application under Section 77 of the  
Act, this Court should not interfere.

As a proposition of law, Mr. R. Venugopala Reddy is right in submitting that  
merely because the objects of an institution are educational in character, it  
does not by itself become a charitable institution. The expression charitable

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purpose' is defined in clause (5) of section 2 of the Act in the following words:- 7

"Charitable purpose' includes:-

(a) relief of poverty or distress;

(b) education;

(c) medical relief;

(d) advancement of any other object of utility or welfare to the general public or a section thereof, not being an object of an exclusively religious nature".

It is an inclusive definition and as held by the Bench of this Court in the decision relied upon by the learned counsel, the predominant purpose must be a charitable one. It has also been held therein, that merely because some objects of the Institution are charitable in nature, the Institution does not become a charitable one. In this case, a reading of the objects of the Institution, as set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association, prima facie appear to show that they are purely educational in nature. But, it is contended by the learned Government Pleader that this Institution has received endowments of extensive lands for its maintenance and must, therefore, be treated as a charitable Institution. Further, this Institution had itself applied for registration under the Act, and was so registered. It also applied for exemption from certain provisions of the Act repeatedly, and only when it failed therein, it has come to this Court by way of this writ petition.



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Moreover, the petitioner has an alternative remedy by way of an application under section 77 of the Act, where all the questions including the history and course of development of this institution, and the disputed questions of fact, if any, can more satisfactorily be gone into and decided. Several irregularities are also alleged in the counter-affidavit; and though it is not necessary for me to pronounce upon the correctness or otherwise of those allegations, the fact remain that there are serious allegations of misfeasance and malfeasance against this institution.

In the circumstances, I am not inclined to go into the merits of the controversy in this writ petition. It is always open to the petitioner to establish its contentions in a petition under section 77 of the Act, or in such other proceedings as it may be advised to take.

The writ petition, accordingly, fails and is dismissed with costs.  
Advocate's fee: 150/-.

For a period of two months, it is directed the status quo obtaining as on today shall continue. This is to enable the petitioner to appoint the DC and to obtain approval orders.

The Court delivered following Judgment



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(Writ Appeal No. 427 of 1981)

(Judgment of the Bench delivered by Upendralal Waghray, J.)

This appeal is filed against the judgment of a learned single judge dismissing the writ petition and observing that it will be open for the appellant to agitate all questions in a properly constituted proceedings under section 77 of the Andhra Pradesh/ Hindu Religious Institutions and Charitable Endowments Act.

It is urged by the counsel for the appellant that the order under appeal is not correct and that it should be held that the petitioner- appellant is not governed by the provisions of the Act /merely imparting education. We do not estimation such a broad proposition arises in this case. Admittedly this institution was included in a list by the Commissioner of Endowments under section 6. Thereafter, it was also registered under section 38 of the Act. The petitioner applied for granting of exemption under certain provisions of the Act, which was rejected. In such circumstances, as disputed questions of fact and law will arise, the direction of the learned judge that the petitioner should approach the Deputy Commissioner under section 77 is appropriate. There is no reason to interfere with the order under appeal. Writ appeal, therefore, is dismissed. No costs. Advocate's fee Rs. 150/-.

ORDER:

Government have reviewed the present status of the Andhra Jateeya Vidyaparishad, Machilipatnam, Krishna district, it was felt that there was a need for restructuring this institution with ut prejudice to the original objectives with a view to achieve larger objectives consistent with the modern educational and cultural requirements. It was also felt that this institution could be developed inter alia for the benefit of women by introducing vocational courses and training facilities in the context of 30% reservation for women in the jobs.

While making coordinated efforts to revitalise this institution, the following factors should be kept in view:-

- I. the name of the institution should remain as Sri Jateeya Vidya Parishad.
- II. the original ideals and standards of performance of this institution should be restored.
- III. emphasis should be on imparting vocational training, particularly for women, relating to modern subjects like electronics, industrial management etc; and extent
- IV. The existing/ of land of about 359 acres should not only be verified and utilised fully but another properties not listed should also be ascertained and included in the list of properties of the institution.

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Considering the fact that an indepth study of various facets of the Institution is required to be undertaken and hereby completed in a short span of time, Government constitute a Committee with the following members.

1. Sri K. Koteswara Rao Ex. M.L.A. .. Member

Adverting to the subject of recognising Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao as the Founder Family Member of Andhra Jateeya Vidya Parishad, the chronological and evidentiary support available on records are mentioned as detailed below :

On 23-08-1998, Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao, made an application to the Assistant Commissioner, Endowments Department, Vijayawada, with a request to recognize him as the Founder Family Member of the Subject Institution.

After following due procedure and enquiry i.e., perusing and examining the approved property register, other connected records and keeping in view of the abolition of Section 16 of Act 30 of 1987 (Abolition of Hereditary Rights), the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in C.M.A.No.908, 1359, 1375 of 1987 and in pursuance of the circular No.40/97 In Rc.No.L3/6330/97, dt.04-10-1997 of the Commissioner, Endowments Department and in exercise of the powers vested with him the Competent Authority and Assistant Commissioner, Vijayawada has recognized Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao, descendant of Founder of the Institution, as Founder Family Member for the Management of the Institution and for all other purposes vide Rc.No.a2/10564/98, dated 26-01-1999. Further, the Competent Authority also mentioned that there is no other person claiming recognition from the Founder's Family.

In this connection, a Revision Petition vide R.P.No.53/99 was filed under Section 92 of the Act by a **third Party** before the Regional Joint Commissioner, Kakinada against the orders of the Assistant Commissioner, Endowments and he allowed the Revision Petition on the ground that any person interested in the welfare of the institution can represent the authorities to set right the management and it is not desirable to continue

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a person facing disciplinary proceedings (Commissioner framed 4 charges against Executive Officer and Founder Family Member, by then) as founder of the institution.

Mean while a charge Memo and Show Cause Notice with four charges vide Rc.No.E2/3247/2000, dt.28-02-2000 was issued by the Commissioner Endowments to the Founder Family Member and Chairman of Trust Board basing on the petition of one Sri V.Venkateswararao, Bandar Town TDP President and Ex.Nominated Chairman of Andhra Jateeya Vidya Parishad, calling for an explanation and Show Cause as to why he (Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao) should not be discontinued from acting as Chairman of the Trust Board and Founder Family Member.

Challenging the same, the Founder Family Member, approached the Hon'ble High Court vide W.P.No.21417/2000. The Hon'ble Court disposed the petition on 29-04-2004 with a direction to conclude the enquiry into the charges within a period of two months and pass appropriate orders.

As the enquiry into the charges was not concluded within the stipulated period prescribed by the Court, the Founder Family Member filed a Contempt case No.31/2005. Then, the Commissioner appointed the Assistant Commissioner & E.O., of P.M.K.Choultry, Rajamahendravaram as an enquiry officer for enquiry. He conducted enquiry and submitted report. Again the Commissioner, called for a further report from the R.J.C., Kakinada. Basing on the two enquiry reports, the charges framed against the Founder Family Member were dropped by the Commissioner and the same was informed to the Hon'ble High court in the above contempt case. The contempt case was closed with an observation that "as the orders of the Court in W.P.No.21417 of 2004 dated 29-4-2004, has already been implemented by issuing the proceedings dated 15-02-2005 (Charge Memo drop proceedings).



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On dropping of charges by the Commissioner, Endowments, the Founder Family Member made a representation to the R.J.C. Kakinada to allow him to manage the Institution affairs. On that an order vide L.Dis.No.A3/1431/05, dt.13-3-2005 was issued. The attention of Sri K.Hanumantha Rao, Founder Family Member is invited to the reference cited and he is informed that he remains Founder Family Member as his order was set aside basing on the pendency of disciplinary proceedings." (enclosed).

Basing on the dropping of charges against Founder Family Member, he filed a writ petition No.7632 of 2006 reporting that the Executive Officer is acting independently in the administration of the Institution, without consulting Founder Family Member. ON that on 18-04-2006, the Court directed the E.O., to act in accordance with Section 29(5)(a) and to conduct birthday celebrations of the Founder to be held on 19-04-2006 duly seeking the advice of the Founder Family Member.

- As the E.O., failed to implement the orders of the High Court, the Founder Family Member, sent a representation dt.1-2-2008 to the Commissioner Endowments to instruct the E.O. to implement the orders. On that the Commissioner, Endowments, instructed the Executive Officer to implement the orders of the Hon'ble High Court and file counter vide Rc.No.G2/4978/2008, dt.19-05-2008.
- Though there are specific orders from the Hon'ble court and the Commissioner, the Executive Officer filed counter and stay vacate petition without implementing its interim order.
- After perusing the Counter, the Interim Order dt.18-04-2006 is made absolute and the vacate petition of E.O. is dismissed by the Hon'ble High Court.
- Again W.P.M.P.No.12122 of 2012 was filed for the same cause of action. On 11-04-2012, the Court directed the E.O. to perform Founder's Day celebrations duly associating with the Founder Family

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Member, the Trustee of the Institution and to file a report on 18-04-2012.

- The Executive Officer filed his Counter Affidavit by narrating the entire scenario right from the recognition of Founder Family Member and the validity of his recognition order in view of the charges dropped by the Commissioner and obeying the lawful orders of the Founder Family Member in the management of the Institution.
- The Court considering the averments made in the Counter Affidavit of the Executive Officer, it felt that no orders need to be passed in this matter and closed the W.P. as the present Executive Officer is proceeding with the activities of the Institution in consultation with the Founder Family Member.

On the representation made by one Sri A.Syam Prasad, Machilipatnam, on 18-10-2013, the Government issued memo to the Commissioner, Endowments vide Endt No.2383/M/Endts/2013 to submit a report regarding constitution of Trust Board to Vidya Parishad.

On that the Commissioner sent a reply vide Memo No.A4/33290/2013, dt.17-02-2014, that " **the Government is requested to nominate Board of Trustees to the Subject Institution keeping in view of the G.O.Ms.No.655, Revenue (Endts.IV) Department, dated 11-7-1990 and including the Founder Family Member as one of the Trustee and chairman of the Board of Trustees.** " The matter is pending with the Government for appointment of the Trust Board.

After assuming as Founder Family Member, Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao, filed number of Writ Petitions in Hon'ble High Court of A.P. to safeguard the entity of the Parishad, to fulfil the founding objectives and got orders for the protection of its entity and made way for continuation of Educational Institutions.

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- By defending a proposal that was moved for amalgamation of the Parishad into Krishna University;
  - Got 30 years lease of the Parishad land to Krishna University.
  - Continuation of B.Ed. course under unaided scheme.
  - Revival of M.Ed. course.
  - Leased out the land of 106 acres of institution for fishing purposes after prolonged legal battle.
  - Trying to get NAAC from the UGC.
  - Setting right the administration which was spoiled by our earlier E.O.s', who are having no knowledge either on the Education Act or education field, illegal appointments made by our E.O.s and high level commission of illegalities in I.T.I. etc.,

As per the instructions of the Commissioner, I have gone through the Letter of Sri Kollu Ravindra, Hon'ble Minister for BC Welfare who raised certain objections over appointing of Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao as Founder Family Member. The following is my report as per the available information on record over the objections:-

### **Allegations:**

- 1) It has come to my notice that Mr. Kopalle Hanumantha Rao who committed several irregularities in the past in Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad has been re-appointed as Founder Family Member of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Machilipatnam in gross violation of the stipulations laid down in the property register of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad in which Founders of the Institution expressly stated that they had not vested hereditary rights in any of their heirs. Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad is not a private institution, but a public one with donations contributed by a large number of philanthropic public. Presently, the Institution is worth crores of rupees. As such, no individual was given right to be appointed as

Founder Family Member. Moreover, the person in question has no connection whatever with the Founder's Family.

**Information on record :**

It is true that some charges were framed against Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao, but after due enquiry, all the charges framed against him are dropped by the Commissioner, Endowments dt.15-02-2005. (enclosed).

It is also true that in Column No.4 of Property Register that there is mention that no hereditary Rights are vested with any of the heir. It is pertinent to mention here that, though the heirs carry any hereditary rights as per property Register, since the Right of Hereditary Trustees were abolished U/s 16 of the Act and which was upheld by the Supreme Court of India vide Pannalal Bansilal Pitti v. State of A.P. AIR 1996 SCC 1023, recognition of the Hereditary Trustee doesn't arise. But basing on the observations of Hon'ble Apex Court, the Department started recognising heirs of the Founder as Member of the Founders' Family. In the light of above judgement:-

- 1) The observation regarding hereditary right in Column No.4 of Property Register does not fold its sanctity; Recognition as Founder Family Member, is different from recognition as Hereditary Trustee.
- 2) As the charges against the Founder Family Member were dropped, the Founder Family Member has autonomy to manage the Institution in co-ordination with the E.O.

The Competent Authority after due enquiry declared Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao as descendant of the Founder of the

Institution in his proceedings dt.27-01-1999 and as no other person claimed recognition except Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao.

**Allegation : 2**

Further Mr. Kopalle Hanumanta Rao faced many charges as FFM in 2000 and he was summarily dismissed by R.J.D. Kakinada.

**Information on record :**

The then Regional Joint Commissioner clubbed the charges issued by the Commissioner and orders of the Assistant Commissioner and held that it is not desirable to continue a person facing disciplinary proceedings as founder of the Institution. In view of the charges dropped by the Commissioner, Endowments, the Revisional Authority order will not come in the way of Founder Family Member to hold the post. The same was communicated by the R.J.C in letter L/Dis.No.A3/1431/05, dt.12-3-2005 (enclosed). As such the orders of R.J.C. in R.P.53/1999 no more exists.

The High Court of A.P. also disposed the Writ Petition filed by Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao in W.P.No.7632/2006, with an observation that the present Executive Officer is proceeding with the activities of the Institution in consultation with the petitioner and considering the submission and averments in the Counter, the Court feels that no orders need to be passed in this matter.

In the submitted facts and circumstances, it is evident that none of the officers have deviated from the Lawful procedures in recognition of Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao as the Founder Family Member.

I further submit that the Government has issued G.O.Ms.No.655, Revenue (Endowments -IV) Dept, dt.11-7-1990 exempting the

Institution so far as it relates to constitution of a Trust Board and recommended a board to be constituted with :

1. One Member from Education Department.
2. One Member from Technical Education Department.
3. Two Members from Endowments.
4. One Academician of Outstanding achievement nominated by Government as Chairman of the Trust Board.  
(as Founder Family Member was recognised, Founder Family Member shall become the Chairman)

It is better to constitute a Trust Board with the above members for the welfare of the Subject Institution instead of a regular Trust Board.

It is submitted that the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad was founded in 1907 by my grand father Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao Parulugaru, under the provisions of Act XXI of 1860 of the Acts of the Viceroy and Governor-General of India in Council (vide No.1/1911-12, dt.19.06.1911 of District Registrar, Krishna District) being an Act for the registration of Literary, Scientific and Charitable societies to impart and promote the imparting of education-Literary, Scientific, Technical and Professional on national lines and exclusively under national control-

attaching special importance to a knowledge of the country, its literature, history and philosophy and designed to incorporate with the best Oriental ideals of life and thought the best assimilable ideals of the West and to inspire students with a genuine love for their country and a real desire to serve it and other objectives as specified in Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao Pantulugaru, M.A., B.L., was a renowned Freedom Fighter with radical approach towards Political Independence of India. He actively participated in Freedom movement across the country closely associating with Sri Lala Lajapathi Roy, Sri Bala Gangadhar Tilak and Sri Bipin Chandra Paul (Lal-Bal-Pal) and also led the Indian National Congress in Andhra Pradesh before Gandhian era. His ideologies had not stuck to the National Movement but also visualized and implemented thoughts to give India an economic background and content. The conglomeration of his ideologies towards Swaraj and in response to the call given by Indian National Congress for "Swadesi Movement" to make India a self-sufficient, gave birth for founding the prestigious Educational Institution, bequeathing entire properties of his family for its establishment. The Institution was inaugurated by "Desabhaktha" Sri Konda Venkatappayya Panthulugaru on 27.03.1910.

The Institution had a mixed personalities from all over India to impart education to the students. In brief we can say that the Institution had an outlook of Andhra, but its appeal is Universal and a great example of "National Integration" then and also revered as mother of Educational Institutions in Andhra province.

Besides teaching of literary, historical and scientific studies, arts and crafts, religious and moral instruction were made curricula of the Institution. The first half-an-hour of every day was set apart for a lesson in the high ideals of the Aryan race, sufficient to express the true individuality of Hinduism. Epics and Puranas were taught to explain the greatness of Hinduism. Boys were also taught the ancient Indian "Swaram" with training in uttering select passages out of the Vedas and Upanishads.



The result of National Education Movement in the pre-Gandhian era, has served our nation by providing quality education to many generations. Eminent scholars like Kavisamrat Sri Viswanatha Satyanarayana (Gnanapeetha Awardee), Sri Pingali Venkaiah (designer of the Indian National Flag), Sri Adivi Bapiraju, and many freedom fighters like Sri Mutnuri Krishna Rao, Sri Bhogaraju Pattabhi Sitaramaiah, "Andhra Rathna" Sri Duggirala Gopala Krishnaiah, Cherala-Perala Freedom Movement have all served the institution and Sri Bezwada Gopala Reddy, former Union Minister studied in this Kalasala.

It is proudly mentioned here that, in 1921, Mahatma Gandhij visited the Institution and stayed for couple of days and wrote following tribute for the Institution:-

*"I have passed two quiet and what shall always remain with me sacred days on the sacred grounds of this great educational institution. The expectation that I had formed of the institution, has been more than realized. I see method, organizing ability and sacrifice written on every inch of those grounds. As an Indian I feel proud of it. As the inhabitants of this great Andhra Province, I hope that all my Andhra friends are equally proud of it, and I hope that you citizens of Masulipatnam, consider it a privilege that you have an institution in your midst, which is manned by men, who are filled with the spirit of sacrifice. I ask you therefore to make this institution your own, strengthen it where you may find it to be weak, strengthen it further, where you may find that there is strength in it. Look up to it as an ideal and try to perfect it in order to perfect your own ideals ....."*

For instance, in the year 1920-21, The Indian National Congress donated an amount of Rs. 27000/- and Madam Anne Besant donated an amount of Rs. 30000/- which helped the institution. In 1961, Dr. Sarvepalli Radha Krishnan, the Vice president of India, attended for the Golden Jubilee Year celebrations and rightly said that "Though the outlook is Andhra, its appeal is universal. It is, therefore, a true example of National Integration." Further, C. Rajagopalachari also responded sending his best wishes for Golden Jubilee Celebrations as "The Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala of Masulipatnam is a vulnerable old institution. This work has been taken up and is being done by many younger institutions also, but our reverence is due to this Mother of Andhra institutions."

The Institution had passed through a tumultuous regime during the peak freedom movement and had its complete revival with the change in Educational System in the free Independence era. The A.J. Kalasala offered U.G. Courses since 07.06.1949. Subsequently, Intermediate (10+2) Education was introduced on 14.06.1969. Further, the A.J. Kalasala was admitted into Grant-in-aid from 01.04.1964. The Engineering workshop offered industrial training courses and later it was redesigned as ITI. In 1959, the Government of Andhra Pradesh granted permission to start Oriental Secondary School to impart Sanskrit Education as one of the subjects. In 1967, the AJ College of Education was started to offer teacher education courses.

Later, the institution has been registered u/s 7(b) of the Act, 17 of 1966 and was taken over by the Endowments Department (Government) on 20.02.1988.

Taking into consideration of historical importance of the institution with present condition, the Govt. of A.P has reviewed the status and felt that there is need for restructuring this institution without prejudice to the original objectives with a view to achieve larger objectives consistently modern educational and cultural requirements and made certain recommendations to revitalize the institution through G.O.Ms. No. 655, Rev (End. IV), Dt: 11.07.1990 vide reference 1<sup>st</sup> cited. Out of which the Government granted permission to the Commissioner, Endowments to explore the possibilities of getting financial assistance under the different schemes of the State Government and the Government of India and send if necessary, specific proposals to the Government. At the same time, the institution must be able to mobilize its own resources coupled with grants being received in a very profitable and useful way.

Now, the institution is under the administrative control of Commissioner, Endowments (Government of Andhra Pradesh) Department and at present, the Executive Officer, Grade-I is administering the institution under my lawful directions.

At present, the Parishad is imparting education under 10+2 category through the following institutions under the administrative control of Government (Endowments Department) under the provisions of A.P. Education Act, 1982:

Our Institution has seen many ups and downs, twists and turns in the course of its history. Though it stands tall in the memories of its alumni, many of them who are now prominent figures in Government, business and industry, the media and education, some have excelled academics, sports, or extra-curricular activities, the glory of its grandeur has been fading slowly, year after year due to retirements and non providing of teaching staff by the State Government and non-availability of even single teaching staff for each subject, the institutions are unable to intake students and assure them with a stable career, questioning their existence and to face extinction. In the current condition, our Institutions are still standing tall and calling for support from various Governmental Schemes, to continue and expand its legacy in various fields.

It is pertinent to mention here that the Samgra Siksha Abhiyan Scheme was introduced to provide quality education, enhancing learning outcomes of students, Bridging Social and Gender Gaps in School Education, ensuring equity and inclusion at all levels of school education, minimum standards in schooling provisions, Promoting Vocationalisation of education & to implement the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education under (RTE) Act, 2009 duly giving flexibility to the States to prioritize their interventions to outreach the objectives of SSA Scheme to all levels of School Education.

Further, the Ministry of School Education & Literacy circulated the guidelines for implementation of Right of Children to free and compulsory Education Act, 2009 and its applicability to minority institutions where specifically mentioned that the institutions including Madrasa and VEDIC PATASALAS especially serving religious and linguistic minorities are protected under Article 29 and 30 of the Constitution and those schools of minority organizations covered



within the meaning of Sec. 2(n) of the Act will be governed by the provisions of the RTE Act, 2009. But, the Schools imparting Sanskrit Education were not included on par with Madrasa and Vedic Patasalas, even though the Sanskrit is identified as Linguistic Minority and Origin of Hindu Vedas.

In view of the orders in G.O. vide reference 1<sup>st</sup> cited, the Commissioner, Endowments has requested the State Project Director through Special CS, School Education Department to extend SSA grants for limited scope towards financial assistance to 5 academic instructors of AJK OS School to impart Sanskrit Education vide reference 2<sup>nd</sup> cited.

Though it is a statutory obligation of the State Government to extend the benefits of Samgra Siksha Abhiyan scheme to all needy Educational Institutions, which are notified in Sec. 2 of RTE Act, 2009, irrespective of category / recognition issued by Government and flexibility given to the states under the scheme to prioritize the interventions to assure quality of education, the State Project Director, SSA has not considered our justified request with a plea that there is no separate budget allocation made in 2019-2020 for the support to the aided Oriental Institutes and informed that our request for sanction of financial aid to 5 Vidya Volunteers / Academic Instructors to AJK Oriental Secondary School under SSA scheme is not feasible for consideration vide reference 3<sup>rd</sup> cited.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, duly considering the objectives of the institution; its prominence during pre-independence era; to continue the legacy of age-old esteemed institution in promoting education for more than 113 Years; present condition of the aided / unaided institutions imparting 10+2 Education under the management of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Machilipatnam, Krishna District, Andhra Pradesh which are under administration of State Government of Andhra Pradesh (Endowments Department), it is requested that the Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, New Delhi may be pleased to consider the institutions:

- 1) to declare as Aspirational Schools.
- 2) for inclusion of above institutions imparting 10+2 education under the administration of State Government (Endowments Dept.) into SSA Scheme on par with Government Schools.

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- 3) for inclusion of AJK Oriental Secondary School on par with Madrasa and Vedic Patasalas as it has been imparting Sanskrit Education since 1959.
- 4) to issue necessary guidelines to the State Project Director, Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, A.P.,
  - i) to exercise the flexibility extended to the States to prioritize these institutions and to consider on par with other Government Schools to extend all benefits in view of the State Government orders vide G.O.Ms. No. 655.
  - ii) to allot budget to aided Oriental Schools and institutions imparting 10+2 Education of AJ Vidya Parishad under the control of Endowments department (Government of Andhra Pradesh) from the Academic Year 2020-21 and
  - iii) to extend the financial support to the Vidya Volunteers / Academic Instructors in the existing vacancies of above mentioned institutions from the academic year 2020-21, till the final decision taken by the Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, New Delhi.

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**THE HON'BLE SRI JUSTICE M.SATYANARAYANA MURTHY**

**WRIT PETITION NO.15015 OF 2020**

**ORDER:**

This writ petition is filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following relief:

"to issue a Writ, Order or Direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of mandamus, declaring the inaction of 1<sup>st</sup> respondent for not considering the aided/unaided institutions imparting 10+2 Education under the management of petitioner institution, which is under the administrative control of State Government of Andhra Pradesh (Endowments Department) for inclusion into the SSA Scheme on par with Government Schools and not considering the AJK Oriental Secondary School, which imparts Sanskrit Education on par with Madrasa and Vedic Patasalas in terms of SSA Scheme, as illegal, arbitrary and violative of Articles 14, 21 and 26 of the Constitution of India, apart from violative of provisions of SSA Scheme and consequently direct the 1<sup>st</sup> respondent to include the aided/unaided institutions imparting Education upto Senior Secondary level under the management of petitioner institution and pass such other order."

2. Though the petitioner made several allegations against the respondents, during the course of hearing learned counsel for the petitioner limited his request to issue a direction to the respondents to dispose of the representation submitted by the petitioner dated 24.07.2020 without touching the merits of the case,.

3. Learned Government Pleader for School Education and learned Government Pleader for Endowments appearing for respondents readily agreed to dispose of the representation submitted by the petitioner dated 24.07.2020, if any, pending with the respondent authorities..

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4. In view of the submission of learned Government Pleader for School Education and learned Government Pleader for Endowments appearing for respondents, I need not decide the truth or otherwise of the allegations made in the petition.

5. This Court is conscious that no such direction be issued in view of the judgment of the Apex Court in "*The Government of India v. P. Venkatesh*"<sup>1</sup>", wherein the Apex Court held that such orders may make for a quick or easy disposal of cases in overburdened adjudicatory institutions. But, they do not serve to the cause of justice. As the learned counsel for the petitioner himself requested to issue a direction to dispose of the representation dated 24.07.2020 submitted by the petitioner, I find no other alternative except to issue such direction.

6. In the result, Writ Petition is *disposed of*, directing the respondent authorities to dispose of the representation submitted by the petitioner dated 24.07.2020, in accordance with law, within two (02) weeks from today. No costs.

As a sequel, miscellaneous applications pending, if any, shall also stand closed.

It is to inform you that vide reference 1<sup>st</sup> cited, you sought my opinion in the subject matter of taking over of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Machilipatnam by Govt. of AP for onwards submission to the Commissioner Endowments Department for taking further action duly enclosing the references 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> cited.

In this connection, you are aware that the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad was established in 1907 by my Grand father Sri Kopalle Hanumantha Rao Panthulu garu to impart and promote education,



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literacy, scientific, technical and professional on national lines as mentioned in the Memorandum and Articles of Association duly registered under the provisions of the Act XXI of 1860 of the Acts of the Viceroy and Governor-General of India in Council (vide No.1/1911-12 dated 19.06.1911 of Deputy Registrar, Krishna District) and such institution is being administered as per the founding objects of the Association.

As a part of its curriculum, the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, at the time of its inception, introduced various courses in ancient Indian fine arts like Shilpa Sastra (Sculpture), Vasthu Sastra, Chitra Lekhana (Drawing) and Weaving. Further, the Institution had passed through a tumultuous regime during the peak freedom movement and had its complete revival with the change in Educational System in the post-Independence era as such the ancient Indian fine art courses were closed due to lack of proper support from the affiliating authorities.

The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad is imparting education through the following subsidiary educational institutions (Private) under the provisions of A.P. Education Act, 1982 prior to the taking over the administration by the Endowments Department:

- 1) The A.J. Kalasala offered U.G. Courses since 07.06.1949. Subsequently, Intermediate (Senior Secondary) Education was introduced on 14.06.1969. The Government of Andhra Pradesh extended grant-in-aid for AJ Kalasala (Composite College) from 1964. (At present it is under un-aided category)
- 2) The AJK Oriental Secondary School was started in 1959 to impart School Education (6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class) with Sanskrit as one of the main subjects. The AJK Oriental Secondary School was started in 1959 to impart School Education (6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class) with Sanskrit as one of the main subjects. The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad established A.J.K. Oriental Secondary School in 1959 to impart education-literacy with history and philosophy of our nation with a mix of knowledge from the Vedas and modern education as the Vedas are considered to be the oldest form of literature in Sanskrit and it is a language of ancient India with a history going back about 3,500 years with primary liturgical language of Hinduism and the predominant language of most works of Hindu philosophy as well as some of the principal texts of Buddhism and Jainism which was migrated to Southeast Asia.

parts of East Asia and Central Asia, emerging as a language of high culture and of local ruling elites in these regions and it is traceable to the 2<sup>nd</sup> millennium BCE in a form known as the Vedic Sanskrit, with the Rigveda as the earliest known composition, though it not necessarily Classical Sanskrit, is the root language of many Prakrit languages such as Hindi, Marathi, Bengali, Punjabi and Nepali. As such, the school curriculum is primarily aimed at promoting Sanskrit language and it is included as main subject for 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> class curriculum in place of Social Studies and was extended grant-in-aid from 1975 by the Government of Andhra Pradesh and still it is in existence as aided school.

- 3) The AJ College of Education was started to offer Teacher Education course (B.Ed) in 1967 and was extended grant-in-aid from 1977.
- 4) The Engineering workshop offered industrial training courses from 1907 and it was re-designed as Industrial Training Institute (ITI) from 1951.

Further the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad was published under section 6 (b) (1) of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious and Endowments Act, 1966 (Act 17 of 1966) duly registered U/s 38 of the Act 17 of 1966. In 1979, the Government issued instructions to the Commissioner, Endowments Department to enquire and submit a report on the affairs of the management. After due consideration of the representation made by the Secretary of Parishad for exempting the Institution U/s. 108 of the Act 17 of 1966, the Government requested the commissioner to constitute a trust board and to appoint an Executive officer for its management.

The Secretary of the Institution filed a review petition dated 12-07-80 to Government U/S. 84 of the AP Act 17 of 1966. There upon, the revisional authority suspended the operation of sections 15 & 27 of the Act, pending final disposal of the said review petition (Govt. Memo. No. 1920/E.I/801, dt: 17-07-1980) and later vacated the order of suspension vide Memo. No. 1920/E.I/80-2, dated 3-9-1980 by rejecting the Review Petition.

There upon, the Managing Trustee/Secretary of the Institution filed a W.P. No. 4534/80 on the file of Hon'ble High Court of Andhra



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Pradesh and obtained injunction in W.P.M.P. No. 7020/80 restraining the Government from giving effect to the Orders issued by the Commissioner vide D.Dis No. G4/45363/80, Dt: 10.09.1980 appointing the E.O. to the institution. Subsequently, the Writ Petition was dismissed and also Writ Appeal vide W.A. No. 427 of 1981 was dismissed on 01.12.1986. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh was pleased to dismiss the writ petition and its appeal, confirming that the Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad was established for charitable purpose to impart education as defined in Clause (5) of section 2 of the Act 17 of 1966.

Meanwhile, Sri K. Koteswara Rao, Editor, Telugu Vidyarthi (Monthly Publication) and Member of Legislative Council, Machilipatnam had submitted a representation to the Government (Letter dated 19-5-1987) requesting to take over the management by the Government to facilitate the development of the historic institution in accordance with the objects for which the institution was founded. In spite of dismissal of the writ petition and writ appeal filed by the Private management of subject Institution against the registration under the Act 17 of 1966 to take over the management of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad by the Endowments Department, upon the request of Sri K. Koteswara Rao, Editor, Telugu Vidyarthi (Monthly Publication), the Government constituted a committee with four persons as members viz., 1) Sri K. Koteswara Rao, 2) Sri G.J.V. Jagannadha Raju, VC, Nagarjuna University 3) Sri Jaffer Nizam representative of Commissionerate of Higher Education and 4) District Collector, Krishna under the convenorship of Commissioner, Endowments to examine and submit a comprehensive report on the following points along with the Committee's recommendations dated 28.05.87.

1. Verification of the Extent of land and Physical infrastructure owned by the Institution.
2. The existing institutional framework and financial resources with reference to the objectives.
3. Identification of new courses, consistent with the changing times.
4. The method and extent of affiliation and associations between the various universities in the State add this Instruction.

5. The pattern of administrative and technical control of this institution vis-a-vis the provisions of the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment Act.

6. The new educational requirements, which this institution can serve in the context of modern science, technology and Human Resources Development.

Meanwhile, pursuant to the dismissal of the Writ Appeal No. 427 of 1981 filed by the private management, the Commissioner, Endowments Department appointed the Executive Officer on 20.02.1988.

The Committee constituted under G.O.Ms. No. 531 Revenue (Endts.IV) Department dated 28.05.1987 has made a comprehensive study of the various issues referred to them and submitted its report through Commissioner, Endowments to Government on 28.03.1988 & 02.05.1990. In turn the Government has carefully studied the reports of the Committee and the recommendations made therein and felt that there is a need for restructuring this institution without prejudice to the original objectives with a view to achieve larger objectives consistent with the modern educational and cultural requirements. As such the Government issued orders on the recommendations of the Committee to restructure this institution without prejudice to the original objectives with a view to achieve larger objectives consistently modern educational and cultural requirements and to revitalize the institution and accorded permission to the Commissioner, Endowments to explore the possibilities of getting financial assistance under the different schemes of the State Government and the Government of India and send if necessary, specific proposals to the Government through G.O.Ms. No. 655, Rev (End. IV), dt. 11.07.1990 vide reference 3rd cited. It is relevant to submit here that the said G.O holds good till date. Further, by virtue of recommendation 11 of G.O.Ms.No.655, Revenue (Endts. IV) Dept., dt.11.07.1990 the Commissioner of Endowments Dept., is requested to explore the possibilities of getting financial assistance under the different schemes of the State Government and the Government of India and send if necessary, specific proposals to the Government. At the same time, the institution must be able to mobilize its own resources coupled with grants being received in a very profitable and useful way.

At present The Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad is imparting education through the following subsidiary educational Institutions in a composite campus with common playground and common auditorium:

In the light of the above said facts and circumstances coupled with the orders of the Hon'ble High Court passed in W.P.No.4534 of 1980 and its Writ Appeal No.427 of 1981, the subject-Institution is covered as a "charitable institution" to impart education through its subsidiary Institutions as per provisions of Section 2(4) of the AP Act 30 of 1987, and as per Section 14 of AP Act 30 of 1987, all the properties belonging to, or given or endowed to a subject-institution shall, vest in the institution.

Further I have gone through the correspondence vide references cited which were circulated to me by you and it is noticed that there is discrepancy of the instructions issued by the Government of AP, and Commissioner of Endowments that the Government of AP sought detailed report from the Commissioner Endowments for taking over of Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala, Machilipatnam considering the status report submitted by the District Collector- Krishna where as the Commissioner's office and your office mentioned that taking over of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Machilipatnam by the Government of AP. Further you are aware that Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad and Andhra Jatheeya

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Kalasala are two different institutions with separate legal entities. Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad is a Private Charitable Institution under the administrative control of Endowments department where as the Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala is a private un-aided subsidiary educational institution of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad, Imparting higher education (Intermediate, UG & PG courses) as like other subsidiary educational institutions of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad.

As the Government of AP has already reviewed the status of the Institution and restructured this Institution without prejudice to the original objectives with a view to achieve larger objectives consistently modern educational and cultural requirements and accorded permission to the Commissioner, Endowments to explore the possibilities of getting financial assistance under the different schemes of the State Government and the Government of India through G.O.Ms. No. 655, Rev (End. IV), dt: 11.07.1990 without disturbing its entity, you are requested to examine the connected records and relevant material in respect of the establishment, continuance and present status of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad and its subsidiary educational institutions in consonance with its founding objectives, and clarify the following queries and circulate the file with all relevant material and the substantial material mentioned in the above queries through your detailed report to offer my opinion on the above subject matter as sought by you.

1. The circumstances led to consider the proposal by the Government to take over Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala (Private Institution) which is under the management of Andhra Jatheeya Vidya Parishad as there is no specific reason to take a decision on taking over of Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala as Hon'ble Chief Minister's assurance in Krishna District.
2. Circulate the note of District Collector - Krishna Dt. 17/10/2024 which was mentioned as the reference in Government memo dated 20.10.2024.
3. Specify whether the Government is intended to taking over the administration of Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala or the Andhra Jatheeya

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Vidya Parishad with the ideology of Government to take such step against these organizations alone in Krishna District.

4. Circulate the relevant rule position to protect the entity of a charitable institution and/or the established procedure to take over of Private charitable institution which is under the administration control of Endowments Department by the Government of AP, if any.
5. The Connected material which is root cause for the formulating such proposal by the Government to take over Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala.
6. In 3<sup>rd</sup> reference the Government sought detailed report from Commissioner, Endowments for taking over Andhra Jatheeya Kalasala by the Government, where as in 4<sup>th</sup> reference the District Collector Mentioned that it is in progress, Hence furnish the stage of such progress with the details of the authority who initiated the process with relevant rule position and
7. Any other relevant information to take a decision on the above said proposal.

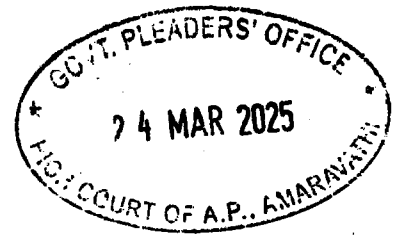
